

Billed to be Malaysia's "next generation hub," the dazzling Kuala Lumpur International Airport 2 (KLIA2) opened its facilities—spanning an area of 257,000 square meters—in May 2014. It's designed to service 45 million passengers a year and features 68 boarding gates, 80 aerobridges and 35,000 square meters of retail space for 225 outlets, and direct rail transport to the heart of Kuala Lumpur.
