Mitsubishi Electric Group's revised materiality and newly defined sub-materiality

TOKYO, June 17, 2026 – [Mitsubishi Electric Corporation](https://www.mitsubishielectric.com) (TOKYO: 6503) today announced revisions to its materiality, which identifies the key issues that the company prioritizes to contribute to sustainability. As part of its transformation into an “Innovative Company” that creates value through bold thinking and a willingness to embrace risk while driving business growth and addressing social and environmental challenges, the company has established “Promote innovation for sustainability” as a new materiality item.

Mitsubishi Electric has also established “sub-materiality” categories for each materiality item to clarify the focus of related initiatives. In addition, it has defined targets and key performance indicators (KPIs) for each item and will implement continuous-improvement activities based on the PDCA cycle through ongoing monitoring and management of progress.

Under its revised materiality, Mitsubishi Electric Group will continue to accelerate its “Trade-On (mutual benefits)” initiatives across its diverse businesses to simultaneously achieve business growth and address social and environmental challenges. Through these efforts, the company aims to create new possibilities for a better tomorrow and further advance sustainability both within the company and throughout global society.

Background of Materiality Establishment and Latest Revision

In response to changes in society and the environment, Mitsubishi Electric formulated its materiality and related initiatives in the fiscal year ended in March 2016, in accordance with the fourth edition of the GRI Guidelines.¹ Five years later, in the fiscal year ended in March 2021, the company comprehensively refined its materiality following extensive internal and external assessments, including surveys and interviews of suppliers, investors, analysts, customers and general consumers as well as company employees. Since then, the company has operated its businesses based on five materiality items: “Realize a sustainable global environment,” “Realize a safe, secure and comfortable society,” “Respect for all people,” “Strengthen corporate governance and compliance on a sustainable basis,” and “Create a sustainability-oriented corporate culture.”

This latest revision was conducted based on the principle of double materiality, which identifies materiality issues by considering not only their financial impact on the company, but also the impact of corporate activities on society and the environment, with reference to relevant sustainability guidelines. The review also took into account evolving corporate strategies, changes in society and environment surrounding corporate management, and [the company’s new corporate philosophy announced on April 1, 2026](#).
