





Note 3: Grease with good thermal conductivity and long-term endurance should be applied evenly with about +100μm~+200μm on the contacting surface of DIIPM and heat sink. The contacting thermal resistance between DIIPM case and heat sink R<sub>th(c-f)</sub> is determined by the thickness and the thermal conductivity of the applied grease. For reference, R<sub>th(c-f)</sub> is about 0.3K/W (per 1/6 module, grease thickness: 20μm, thermal conductivity: 1.0W/m·k).

- Note 4 : SC protection works only for N-side IGBT. Please select the external shunt resistance such that the SC trip-level is less than 2.0 times of the current rating.




Fig. 3 Temperature of LVIC vs.  $V_{OT}$  output characteristics

 5 : DIIPM don't shutdown IGBTs and output fault signal automatically when temperature rises excessively. When temperature exceeds the protective level that user defined, controller (MCU) should stop the DIIPM. Temperature of LVIC vs. VOT output characteristics is described in Fig. 3. These minimum and maximum curves are based on theoretical designed value excluding LVIC temperature=85°C limits.  
 6 : Fault signal Fo outputs when SC or UV protection works. Fo pulse width is different for each protection modes. At SC failure, Fo pulse width is a fixed width which is specified by the capacitor connected to C<sub>FO</sub> terminal. (C<sub>FO</sub>=9.1 x 10<sup>-6</sup> x t<sub>FO</sub> [F]), but at UV failure, Fo outputs continuously until recovering from UV state. (But minimum Fo pulse width is the specified time by C<sub>FO</sub>.)  
 7 : The characteristics of bootstrap Di is described in Fig.2.





Fig. 4  $V_{OT}$  output circuit



- (1) It is recommended to insert 5.1kΩ pull down resistor for getting linear output characteristics at low temperature below room temperature. When the pull down resistor is inserted between  $V_{OT}$  and  $V_{NC}$ (control GND), the extra circuit current, which is calculated approximately by  $V_{OT}$  output voltage divided by pull down resistance, flows as LVIC circuit current continuously. In the case of using  $V_{OT}$  for detecting high temperature over room temperature only, it is unnecessary to insert the pull down resistor.
- (2) In the case of using  $V_{OT}$  with low voltage controller like 3.3V MCU,  $V_{OT}$  output might exceed control supply voltage 3.3V when temperature rises excessively. If system uses low voltage controller, it is recommended to insert a clamp Di between control supply of the controller and  $V_{OT}$  output for preventing over voltage destruction.
- (3) In the case of not using  $V_{OT}$ , leave  $V_{OT}$  output NC (No Connection).

Refer the application note for this product about the usage of  $V_{OT}$ .





Note 10: DIIPIM might not make response if the input signal pulse width is less than PWIN(on).

Note 11: DIIPIM might make no response or delayed response (P-side IGBT only) for input pulse width less than PWIN(off). Over rated collector current ( $I_c$ ) operation, DIIPIM might make delayed response even if the input signal pulse width is PWIN(off) or more. The timing charts are described as below.





Fig. 5 Timing Charts of The DIIPM Protective Functions


[A] Short-Circuit Protection (N-side only with the external shunt resistor and RC filter)

- a1. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.
- a2. Short circuit current detection (SC trigger)  
(It is recommended to set RC time constant 1.5~2.0 $\mu$ s so that IGBT shut down within 2.0 $\mu$ s when SC.)
- a3. All N-side IGBT's gates are hard interrupted.
- a4. All N-side IGBTs turn OFF.
- a5. F<sub>O</sub> outputs. The pulse width of the Fo signal is set by the external capacitor C<sub>F<sub>O</sub></sub>.
- a6. Input = "L": IGBT OFF
- a7. F<sub>O</sub> finishes output, but IGBTs don't turn on until inputting next ON signal (L→H).  
(IGBT of each phase can return to normal state by inputting ON signal to each phase.)
- a8. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.



[B] Under-Voltage Protection (N-side, UV<sub>D</sub>)

- b1. Control supply voltage V<sub>D</sub> exceeds under voltage reset level (UV<sub>Dr</sub>), but IGBT turns ON by next ON signal (L→H).  
(IGBT of each phase can return to normal state by inputting ON signal to each phase.)
- b2. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.
- b3. V<sub>D</sub> level drops to under voltage trip level. (UV<sub>Dt</sub>).
- b4. All N-side IGBTs turn OFF in spite of control input condition.
- b5. F<sub>O</sub> outputs for the period set by the capacitance C<sub>F<sub>O</sub></sub>, but output is extended during V<sub>D</sub> keeps below UV<sub>Dr</sub>.
- b6. V<sub>D</sub> level reaches UV<sub>Dr</sub>.
- b7. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.

## [C] Under-Voltage Protection (P-side, $UV_{DB}$ )

- c1. Control supply voltage  $V_{DB}$  rises. After the voltage reaches under voltage reset level  $UV_{DBr}$ , IGBT turns on by next ON signal (L→H).
- c2. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.
- c3.  $V_{DB}$  level drops to under voltage trip level ( $UV_{DBt}$ ).
- c4. IGBT of the correspond phase only turns OFF in spite of control input signal level, but there is no  $F_o$  signal output.
- c5.  $V_{DB}$  level reaches  $UV_{DBr}$ .
- c6. Normal operation: IGBT ON and outputs current.





Fig. 6 Example of Application Circuit




- (1) If control GND is connected with power GND by common broad pattern, it may cause malfunction by power GND fluctuation. It is recommended to connect control GND and power GND at only a point N1 (near the terminal of shunt resistor).
- (2) It is recommended to insert a Zener diode D1(24V/1W) between each pair of control supply terminals to prevent surge destruction.
- (3) To prevent surge destruction, the wiring between the smoothing capacitor and the P, N1 terminals should be as short as possible. Generally a 0.1-0.22μF snubber capacitor C3 between the P-N1 terminals is recommended.
- (4) R1, C4 of RC filter for preventing protection circuit malfunction is recommended to select tight tolerance, temp-compensated type. The time constant R1C4 should be set so that SC current is shut down within 2μs. (1.5μs~2μs is recommended generally.) SC interrupting time might vary with the wiring pattern, so the enough evaluation on the real system is necessary.
- (5) To prevent malfunction, the wiring of A, B, C should be as short as possible.
- (6) The point D at which the wiring to CIN filter is divided should be near the terminal of shunt resistor. NU, NV, NW terminals should be connected at near NU, NV, NW terminals when it is used by one shunt operation. Low inductance SMD type with tight tolerance, temp-compensated type is recommended for shunt resistor.
- (7) All capacitors should be mounted as close to the terminals as possible. (C1: good temperature, frequency characteristic electrolytic type and C2:0.22μ-2μF, good temperature, frequency and DC bias characteristic ceramic type are recommended.)
- (8) Input logic is High-active. There is a 3.3kΩ(min.) pull-down resistor in the input circuit of IC. To prevent malfunction, the input wiring should be as short as possible. When using RC coupling, make the input signal level meet the turn-on and turn-off threshold voltage.
- (9) Fo output is open drain type. Fo output will be max 0.95V(@IFO=1mA,25°C), so it should be pulled up to MCU or control power supply (e.g. 5V,15V) by a resistor that makes IFOup to 1mA. (In the case of pulled up to 5V, 10kΩ is recommended.) About driving opto coupler by Fo output, please refer the application note of this series
- (10) Fo pulse width can be set by the capacitor connected to CFO terminal.  $C_{FO}(F) = 9.1 \times 10^{-6} \times t_{FO}$  (Required Fo pulse width).
- (11) If high frequency noise superimposed to the control supply line, IC malfunction might happen and cause DIIPM erroneous operation. To avoid such problem, line ripple voltage should meet  $dV/dt \leq \pm 1V/\mu s$ ,  $V_{ripple} \leq 2V-p-p$ .
- (12) For DIIPM, it isn't recommended to drive same load by parallel connection with other phase IGBT or other DIIPM.

Fig. 7 MCU I/O Interface Circuit





Design for input RC filter depends on PWM control scheme used in the application and wiring impedance of the printed circuit board.

DIIPM input signal interface integrates a minimum 3.3kΩ pull-down resistor. Therefore, when inserting RC filter, it is necessary to satisfy turn-on threshold voltage requirement.

Fo output is open drain type. It should be pulled up to the positive side of 5V or 15V power supply with the resistor that limits Fo sink current  $I_{F0}$  under 1mA. In the case of pulling up to 5V supply, over 5.1kΩ is needed. (10kΩ is recommended.)


Fig. 8 Pattern Wiring Around the Shunt Resistor

Fig. 9 Pattern Wiring Around the Shunt Resistor (for the case of open emitter)


When DIIPM is operated with three shunt resistors, voltage of each shunt resistor cannot be input to CIN terminal directly. In that case, it is necessary to use the external protection circuit as below.



- (1) It is necessary to set the time constant  $R_f C_f$  of external comparator input so that IGBT stops within  $2\mu s$  when short circuit occurs. SC interrupting time might vary with the wiring pattern, comparator speed and so on.
- (2) It is recommended for the threshold voltage  $V_{ref}$  to set to the same rating of short circuit trip level ( $V_{sc(ref)}$ : typ. 0.480V).
- (3) Select the external shunt resistance so that SC trip-level is less than specified value ( $\approx 2.0$  times of rating current).
- (4) To avoid malfunction, the wiring A, B, C should be as short as possible.
- (5) The point D at which the wiring to comparator is divided should be close to the terminal of shunt resistor.
- (6) OR output high level when protection works should be over 0.510V ( $\approx$  maximum  $V_{sc(ref)}$  rating).
- (7) GND of Comparator, GND of  $V_{ref}$  circuit and  $C_f$  should be not connected to power GND but to control GND wiring.
